Dear partner,

We would like to inform you about the possibilities of arranging school visits to Sa Bassa Blanca Museum, near the town of Alcudia, which are included as part of the educational program activities of “*Sa Nostra*”.

In **The Art of the animals and little Princes of History**, we offer a dynamic visit, through which you’ll find on one hand, our main collection, NINS, consisting of portraits of children from the XVI - XIX Century. On the other hand, the visit is completed with a walk through the ZOO, an outdoor sculpture park, made by the artists Yannick Vu and Ben Jakober, and the SUN STELAE, an open space where you’ll find a contemporary interpretation of an ancient megalithic monument, consisting of twelve megaliths, which students can experience the connection between the Earth and the Universe. Finally, the activity includes a visit to the SOKRATES space, where there are dialogues between ancient art (Nepal and Tibet objects or an extinct animal’s skeleton) and contemporary works (such as paintings of Miquel Barceló, Ferrán García Sevilla and Gerhard Merz).

Students of all ages can learn to see that our world is full of symbols, and how men throughout history have used them to express themselves.

Our work methodology for the visits has been modified and extended. Now, we supply educators with all the material they will need. A Guide is available (coinciding with the requested educational level) containing activities, enabling the students to work in the classroom before and after the visit. To maintain homogeneity in the transmission of information, the instructors who accompany the visits, also work with these guide books.
